New Framework for Birmingham Day Services

We are extremely pleased to be able to inform everyone that we have been successful in our tender to be part of the new Birmingham City Council (BCC) framework. This means we will be on a list of approved providers that Social Workers can use when looking for the right services to meet people's needs for day opportunities.

It is also wonderful to see that, for the first time ever, brain injured people are referred to when defining the different types of disabled users. This has also been recognised in the rates tables.

The council is still working through the migration to this new system, but we are hopeful that we will see improvements in getting people assessed and starting sooner during the next year. We are also making headway in meeting with key council people and fixing up talks to Social Worker teams in the New Year. We now have a firm contract for the first time ever with Birmingham City Council and things are 'on the up'.
