
# **HEADWAY MATTERS**



She invited Paul Kelly from Red Quadrant, to Headway House in January to meet with a group of Headway clients to hear their viewpoint firsthand.

"Paul's visit created an opportunity for those with brain injury to explain why they think Headway is the right place for them, and what they would like to see more or less of in relation to 'living their best life', said Helen. "Clients spoke openly about accessing transport, opportunities and acceptance in the wider community, and most importantly, of being able to choose. They expressed how long it took for them to travel to Headway, and how they feel funding and funding cuts stand in the way of their much-needed rehabilitation programmes."

Helen ended: "The day was a very interactive one, with some serious points being very well made."

The findings from the 'Images of Possibilities' study will be reported in due course.

Meanwhile, on a lighter note, Headway House client, Barry Carter, showcased his amazing artistic talent by drawing a portrait of Paul during the visit, something Paul was absolutely delighted by!

Our Lifestyle service is all about offering one to one support to those with brain injury in their homes and in the community, helping them become more independent and live fuller, richer lives.

It includes enabling with practical issues, travelling to medical appointments, taking part in sport or leisure activities or training in daily living skills, like cooking, shopping or budgeting. The list is endless, and every week our Lifestyle team offer support for a whole range of activities, chosen by the clients themselves.

In the last couple of months alone, our Life-

style Workers have supported clients with a successful online application for a Blue Badge, trips to the gym, doing some voluntary work, completing some essential sewing repairs, visiting a

garden centre and much more besides!

Even the simplest activities can be life-enhancing, such as a recent trip out to a local café for a catch-up, a coffee and a game of chess, as illustrated by our client Michael (above left) and his support worker, Parm!


#### **Wellbeing Day**

### **Unique opportunities at our Charity Shops!**

Our charity shops are an important source of income for us, but they are increasingly so much more than that. They provide an opportunity for our own clients to try their hand at volunteering like Lifestyle client Max Loxley, left, who now regularly helps at our shop in New Road, Rubery.

While his special area of responsibility is checking the DVDs and sorting the games and jigsaws to ensure there are no missing pieces, he also chats confidently to customers and even reminds them about Gift Aid, helping donations go further!

A group of young people from Heart of Birmingham Vocational College (a college supporting students aged 16-25 with special educational needs and/or autism) have also been completing volunteering placements at our charity shops in Great Barr.

Jackie Bickley, who manages our Great Barr shops, said: "The volunteers have been helping hang clothes and keep the rails and shelves tidy in Headway Fashion while in Headway Homes, they have been involved in labelling and putting out the stock."

They were also tasked with creating a special Mother's Day display, a project they made a very good job of. The placements are helping the young people build confidence and practical skills to prepare them for future employment.

#### Advanced level training

Our ABI Manager Sarah Wood successfully completed the advanced level First Aid at Work Instructor Course with training provider NUCO Training in Telford recently.

The course, which includes the Level 3 Award in Education in Training, means Sarah is now qualified to teach and assess the first aid qualifications needed by our staff, including First Aid at Work and CPR (Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation), along with anaphylaxis treatment and oxygen therapy. This will be a huge advantage to us now we can train our many staff 'in-house'.

She will also ensure staff and volunteers are trained and confident in the use of the defibrillators we have at each of our three brain injury centres. *Congratulations*, *Sarah!* 



#### Wheel'n'Walk returns this summer!

Wheel'n'Walk 2023 was a hugely successful event involving 150+ people from ten different local disability charities, including ourselves. ### **New Lottery for Birmingham charities**

The all-new Birmingham Community Lottery was launched in February, and Headway Birmingham & Solihull is set to be part of it!
